

## Oliphants citrus farm expansion completed

21-12-2011 - The Draft Basic Assessment for the expansion of the existing Oliphants Kop farming operation has been published for comment ahead of being submitted to the Eastern Cape Department of Economic Development, Environmental Affairs and Tourism for a Record of Decision.

Habata Boerdersy is proposing to develop three parcels of land totalling about 74 hectares for the cultivation of citrus.

The project will create approximately 70 permanent jobs and 300 seasonal employment opportunities with a value of about R8 million a year.

The development, situated 37 kilometres to the north-east of Port

Elizabeth, will source the labour from the Metro and the Sundays River Valley Municipality.
