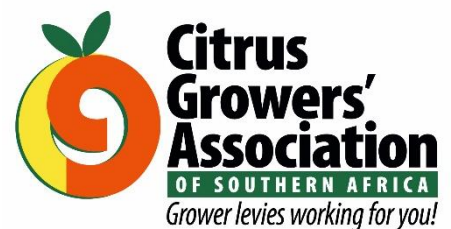

Complete this activity to test your knowledge of the entire chapter:

1. Why does a farm need a team of scouts?

A single individual cannot properly monitor the health of all the trees on a large farm.

2. What are the two methods of ongoing monitoring?

Visual scouting and sampling.

3. What are scouts responsible for?

Conducting regular visual inspections in the orchard and gathering data for analysis.

4. Who collects soil and leaf samples when needed, and where are these samples sent?

They are collected by scouts and sent to laboratories.

5. What is the best way to keep scouting records?

In the same format, ideally using a standardised form.

6. What should scouting data include?

The tree's location and age, the specific symptoms observed, and any environmental or production-related factors that could affect plant nutrition.

7. What is the purpose of scouting team meetings?

To get feedback, check in with the scouts, and inform them of any changes to procedure.
