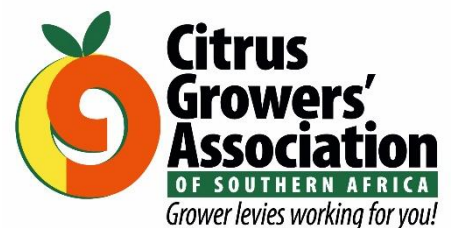

4. What are the two types of waste?

Non-biodegradable and biodegradable waste.

5. What two types of non-biodegradable waste are there?

Recyclable and non-recyclable waste.

6. Why do records of waste management need to be kept?

To show the effectiveness of the waste management plan, to make improvements where necessary, and to meet regulatory requirements.

1. What does it mean to keep an orchard hygienic?

Keeping an orchard clean and free from plant material.

2. What is the value of having a hygienic orchard?

Production practices are easier, and pests and diseases breed less.

These unwanted organisms reproduce in decaying plant matter.

4. What key orchard hygiene practices should you implement?

Waste removal, weed removal, equipment cleaning and maintenance, and water system management.

5. How should equipment be sanitised?

Disinfectants, according to the manufacturers' instructions.

6. Which production practices require sanitation tasks to be performed right after them?

Harvesting or pruning.
